## WE'RE MOVING FORWARD!

Fifty-two persons were in attendance at Faith UMC's January 29, 2016 Charge Conference, led by District Superintendent Alan Davis. Pat Slack, chair of the Building Accessibility Committee, presented information to the group, assisted by Lee McQueen. Also present and contributing was Curtis Betz of RMV Construction.

Testimonials as to the need for handicap accessibility were given by Tony and Kerri Miller, Penny Buettner, Pastor Perry, Kathy Garrelts, and Ed Kohel.

The Charge Conference was requested to accept the construction bid, direct the Pastor to request approval from the Bishop, and proceed to contract with the low bidder (RMV Construction) and construct this project.

The base bid price plus concrete is \$571,000. We need to raise \$115,000; the plan is to continue to fundraise and finance (take out a loan) if necessary.

Following questions and comments, a vote was taken to approve the blueprints, contractor's bid, and budget and financing plan. The final vote was 43 yea and 4 nay. Motion passed.

Faith owes a huge debt of thanks to those who have served tirelessly on the Building Accessibility Committee: Pat Slack (Chairperson), Marlys Bauer, Bob Bradley, Carolyn Forney, Lee McQueen, Kerri Miller, Roger Townsend, Norm Vinderslev, Roger Wisch, and Patty McQueen (nonvoting secretary).

If all goes according to plan, groundbreaking will occur shortly after the ground is thawed this spring.

Heart disease is the number one killer in the U.S. It is also a major cause of disability. There are many different forms of heart disease. The most common cause of heart disease is narrowing or blockage of the coronary arteries, the blood vessels that supply blood to the heart itself. This is called coronary artery disease and happens slowly over time.

Other kinds of heart problems may happen to the valves in the heart, or the heart may not pump well and cause heart failure. Some people are born with heart disease.

You can help reduce your risk of heart disease by taking steps to control factors that put you at greater risk:

### New Lights In The Sanctuary Trivia

Each of the six old hanging light fixtures in the sanctuary contains four bulbs (three small and one huge). The difference in wattage between the old bulbs and the new LED ones is a savings of **668 watts** per fixture. For the six fixtures, that is a savings of **4,005 watts**. The total watts savings for all lights replaced with LED bulbs is 5,161 watts.

Now **THAT** should make a difference in the electric bill!





## LET THERE BE (NEW) LIGHTS (and Clean Ceiling Fans)

The Renovation Committee has recently disbanded after 16 years of fundraising and renovating at Faith Church. We have enjoyed many different fundraisers over the years -- potato bars, spaghetti dinners, golf tournaments, ice cream socials, BBQs and Praise Band Concerts, sales of T-shirts, sweatshirts and aprons, chili cook-offs, candy sales, Prime Festivals, Home, Lawn and Garden Shows and work projects for members at their homes. Our congregation has been so supportive of Renovations with their donations of food, volunteering to help with the events and supporting fundraisers in general. The fundraisers have provided good fun and fellowship and many good memories.

Since 2002 our fundraisers have taken in over \$85,919.00. We have been able to renovate the kitchen, downstairs and upstairs Sunday School rooms, put new doors on the south side of the church, replace windows for the church, provide part of the

kitchen remodel at the parsonage, remodel stage area, paint sanctuary, carpet the sanctuary, put new tile downstairs, carpet fellowship hall, folding curtains in sanctuary, recover pew cushions, wallpaper the over-flow room and entry way --- just to name a few. Our last major project was completed this week when the ceiling fans and beams in the sanctuary were cleaned and new LED lights were installed.

This has all been possible with your help. For example, we have served Prime Festival (one of our biggest fundraisers every year) since 2001. Faith has provided a total of 757 pies for Prime Festivals. The people attending Prime have loved every piece. We always got compliments on the variety of pies we had available!!! Thank you Faith pie makers!!!

It all started with the vision and dreams of seven women after rain damage in 1999 created the need to get new carpet for the sanctuary and complete other needed maintenence projects at the church. It seems to be the ultimate example, sixteen years later, of the expression "one thing leads to another". We give God the glory for what we were able to accomplish for the church as the Renovation Committee and thank each one for your help and support all these years.

## What is Lent and Why Does It Last Forty Days?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring". The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of selfexamination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

## TOP TEN THINGS YOU CAN TRY FOR THE LENTEN SEASON

(Author Rev. Penny Ford is the pastor of a small UMC church in Carrollton, Alabama.)

- **10. Try an electronic fast.** Give up TV, Facebook, texting, tweeting, e-mail and all things electronic for one day every week. (Or everyday of Lent!) Use the time to read and pray.
- **9. Start a prayer rhythm.** Each day of Lent, pray for another person.
- 8. Go deeper into the Bible.
- 7. Forgive someone who doesn't deserve it (maybe even yourself.)
- 6. Give up soft drinks, fast food, tea or coffee. Give the money you save to help folks in a different part of the world who are in crisis.
- 5. Create a daily quiet time. Spend 10 minutes a day in silence and prayer. See how it can help you add spiritual practice to your daily life beyond Lent.
- 4. Cultivate a life of gratitude. Write someone a thank you letter each week and be aware of how many people have helped you along the way.
- **3.** Participate in a Lent Photo-a-Day practice and pray each day with your camera in your hand.
- 2. Volunteer one hour or more each week with a local shelter, tutoring program, nursing home, prison ministry.
- **1. Pray for others you see**, as you walk to and from classes or drive to and from work.
