On November 15, 2015, Patricia James was Covered in Prayer. I received this e-mail from her sister:

Dear Friends and Family,

My sister Pat James, who was diagnosed with Stage 3 rectal cancer just about one year ago, has finished her treatment. She had chemo immediately after the diagnosis, then surgery, and then another round of "hot" chemo to make sure that they got it all. She finished with her last chemo on August 31. A week later she had a CAT scan to determine if there was still any cancer. She has found out the results of that scan: She is cancer free...they found no more cancer. She will live with a colostomy bag for the rest of her life, BUT she will live the rest of her life!!

I cannot begin to thank you all for your prayers and good wishes. Many of you shared stories of hope which I passed along to Pat during that very scary time as she began her treatments. Please say one more round of prayers of thanksgiving and then turn your attention to another dear soul who is in need of God's protection and graces. If you put Pat on a prayer chain, please pass along this good report and our thanks for the extra prayers.


